USA tour on Unconventional Gas Production... June 20th-28th 2015

Louis Allstadt and I invite you to join others from South Australia (SA), including Troy Bell (Lib. MP for Mount Gambier) on a trip to the USA to see for ourselves the effects of Unconventional Gas Production - FRACKING.



Lou Allstadt, who when he retired in 2000 was Executive Vice President of Mobil, running the company's exploration and production operations in the western hemisphere.

In addition to his own presentation he has organised world class speakers for us to listen to:

Anthony Ingraffea – the fracking process; Robert Howarth – methane concerns; Sandra Steingraber – human health; Jannette Barth – the socio-economic view; Michelle Bamberger and Robert Oswald – animal health. Your questions and that of others will put all speakers under the spotlight. For this the venue is Ithaca, with its stunning scenery of waterfalls and gorges at the world famous "Finger Lakes".

We will visit farms where fracking has occurred, speaking to farmers about their experiences, see firsthand any effect on their lives and that of towns-people. While we are there, we will visit New York's including famous attractions Empire State Building which provides a panoramic view of New York, travel on the Duquesne Incline (voted one of the top ten sites in the world for viewing a cityscape) and stay the night at one of the world's finest - The Niagara Falls.



I'm not an academic able to draw on an abundance of words and lines to best describe the situation that I, along with thousands others in our region find ourselves in. I'm a third generation farmer, now a grandfather on our modest yet beautiful property with scattered red gums in one of the most productive agricultural areas in South Australia.



Our region is home to a variety of horticulture including the Coonawarra Vineyards that are known around the world, a potato industry, stone fruit orchards, cropping, dairying and the livestock industries that I am involved in..... beef and prime lamb production. These and more in general rely heavily on one of two pristine aquifers that lie beneath the ground for irrigation. This

very water effectively ends up on the table, (possibly your table), in the form of food and wine in homes not only in Australia but around the world. Is there a chance of it being contaminated? In addition townspeople rely on this precious asset including Mt Gambier's residents who draw from the famous Blue Lake. If our ground water was to become contaminated it would have a major effect on our region. Is this likely and if so – for how many generations? You ask the questions.

To research areas that have been fracked over a number of years for SHALE gas (as below our region), I turned to the USA. One farmer I spoke to had stock die after the fracking chemicals (as confirmed by the EPA) came up into the ground water which the stock were drinking [Ref Louis & Donna Meeks]. Another farmer I spoke to had cattle die from brain tumors with his vet tracing the cause to naturally occurring toxic "sulphites" that came up into stock water after fracking released them from a thousand meters or so down [Ref Bill Garland]. That, along with other testimonials has led me to realise the importance of getting a group of people over to the US. There we can see for ourselves whether we could reasonably expect detrimental effects in our region on the flip side of the jobs & royalties. Upon our return you will be invited to report back to the Australian public, including an option to be part of a submission to the State Parliamentary Inquiry into Fracking.
